Address Long Black Organic Cafe, Shop 2/428 New Canterbury Road, Dulwich Hill, 9560 0818.

Open daily 8am-3pm.

Opened last year by Salvadorean-born sisters Mary and Nancy Sansur and their Greek sister-in-law, Jenny Sansur, this small eatery is committed to organic produce. It has tapped into a ready market in the changing demographic of Dulwich Hill.

Business people mix with groups of food-conscious new mothers making for an at-times-noisy but community feel. Sweet and savoury muffins (\$5-\$6) are baked daily – the mandarin and almond is a favourite – but change with market variations. The food is brunch-oriented: we share a three-egg coriander and chilli omelet (\$13), which is fluffy light and spicy hot. The popular Long Black burger (\$10.90) with organic beef, avocado,

rocket, beetroot, fetta and tomato relish is for those a bit more than peckish. But the knockout punch is the Fair Trade organic coffee (\$3/\$4) blended by Belaroma. It's strong but not overbearing and, most importantly, consistent. Despite a tiny, open kitchen, service is usually warm and brisk, though sometimes a little manic in peak hours. The decor is basic – black and white with concrete floors – but still welcoming.
